From 1992/93 to 2000/2001 the Australian One Day domestic cup was named after sponsor, Mercantile Mutual, a now defunct insurance and financial services company.

Anyone from that era, would surely remember the “signs”, whereby batsmen hitting specific signs around the ground won large cash prizes. Players like Shane Lee and Steve Waugh famously won significant money by hitting these signs, which jackpotted if not struck in a match.

## RED HERRING

Edmund Herring Oval was one of Melbourne's most boutique grounds, hosting MCA matches (Barnawartha North's home base). Deemed a postage stamp of a ground opposite Melbourne Grammar School, featuring a bluestone retaining wall, solid clubrooms and an excellent turf square.

April 2017: Edmund Herring Oval was closed to facilitate construction of the new Domain metro station.

September 2024: Landscaping underway at Edmund Herring Oval with the installation of irrigation and reinstatement of the bluestone retaining wall.

February 2025: Council confirmed that Edmund Herring Oval grass oval will soon be made available again for community sport (following completion of the Metro Tunnel project).

**February 2026: Edmund Herring Oval has not yet been re-opened to the public.**



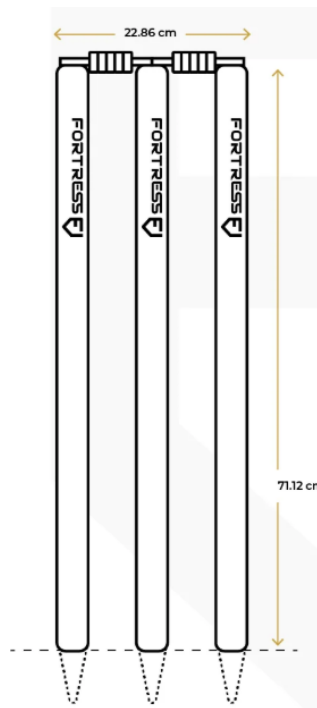
# CENTREMETRE PERFECT

## MCC LAWS OF CRICKET: LAW 8: THE WICKETS

Tops of the stumps shall be 28 inch/71.12 cm above the playing surface.

The bails, when in position on top of the stumps, shall not project more than ½ inch/1.27 cm above them.

Each Wicket shall be 9 inches/22.86 cm in width.

Tape measures available at your nearest Bunnings for under \$10.



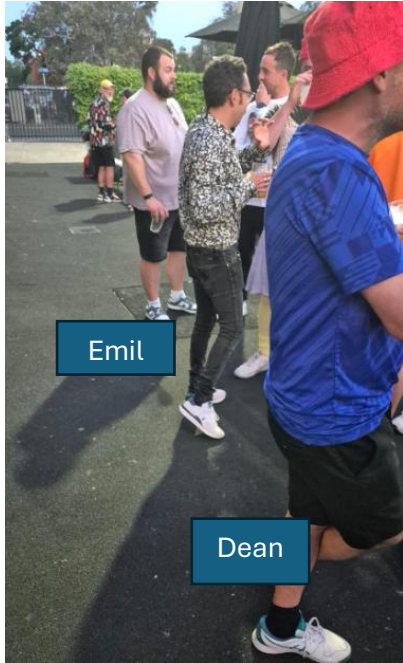
**Editor's treat:** First reader to answer this question is eligible for a free tape measure:
